



COMMANDING OFFICER

USS STARK (FFG-31)

Commander Henry G. Ulrich III was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on 22 June 1950. He entered the United States Naval Academy from his hometown of Southampton, Pennsylvania in June 1968. Graduating in June 1972 with a Bachelor of Science degree he was commissioned an Ensign in the United States Navy and was assigned to the USS CONNITZ (DDG-49). From there he was assigned to the Department Head Course of the Surface Warfare Officer's School. Upon completion of this course of instruction in April 1976, he was assigned to the USS W. S. SIMMS (FF-1059) as the Weapons Officer.

In August of 1978, he was transferred to Washington D. C. as Flag Lieutenant and aide to the Commander, Naval Sea System Command. In Monterey California, after completing research and a thesis on laser target damage phenomena he graduated with distinction and was awarded a Master of Science in Physics Degree.

In January 1982 he returned to the Atlantic Fleet as the Commissioning Executive Officer of USS STARK (FFG-31). In June 1984 he reported to the Commander, Destroyer Squadron 24 as the Chief Staff Officer. During this assignment he deployed to South America, Northern Europe and the Mediterranean.


In September 1986, he was promoted to his current rank of Commander and assigned to the Navy staff in Washington, D. C. as the Head of the Cruise Missile Section. He was later assigned to the Chief of Naval Operations Strategic Think Tank as an advisor to the CNO on Strategic Affairs. In August 1988, he entered the National War College as a student with the class of 1989.

Commander Ulrich's personal decorations include the Navy's Achievement, Commendation and Meritorious Service Medals. He's keen on sailing, golfing and fitness. He also plays tennis with more enthusiasm than skill. In 1975, he married Mary Francis Bivins of Naples, Italy. They have three school-aged children: Harry, Megan, and Alexandra.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER



LCDR EARLE S. YERGER III, USN



He graduated from the University of North Florida in August, 1977 with a BBA in Finance. He was commissioned from OCS in January, 1978.

After attending Surface Warfare Officers School basic course, LCDR Yerger reported aboard USS FOREST SHERIDAN (DD-951). He served in various billets including ASW Officer, Communications Officer, Main Propulsion Assistant, and CIC Officer. During his tour, he made one MIDEAST Force deployment, one Med deployment, an RTOB and several exercises and contingency operations, including the 1979 Sandinista revolution in Nicaragua.

LCDR Yerger next served on the staff of Fleet Training Group, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. During his tour he taught conventional steam engineering and damage control on board a wide variety of surface ships undergoing refresher training, as well as conducting OPPE Certifications for steam and gas turbine ships. In addition to training USN personnel, he supervised training on the last U.S. Coast Guard steamships and West German Adams class destroyers.

His next assignment was to the Naval post Graduate School in Monterey, CA. During his time in Monterey, LCDR Yerger completed the requirements for XX25 and XX27 subspecialty codes and earned a Master of Arts in National Security Affairs.

Following NPS, LCDR Yerger's first department head tour was a Chief Engineer on CHARLES F. ADAMS (DDG-2) homeported in Mayport, Florida. During his time aboard ADAMS, LCDR Yerger deployed again to the Middle East as well as another Mediterranean deployment. During his time aboard ADAMS, successfully completed two regularly scheduled Operational Propulsion Plant Exams and received SURFLANT awards for engineering and damage control excellence. In addition, the ADAMS was awarded the SURFLANT Battle Efficiency Award for destroyers for two consecutive cycles.

LCDR Yerger next reported aboard the USS BELKNAP (CG-26), flagship of Commander, Sixth Fleet, homeported in Gaeta, Italy. While serving as Chief Engineer in BELKNAP, LCDR Yerger supervised the ship's first successful full power trial in five years, successfully completed OPPE and DISLEX and participated in numerous exercises and contingency operations in Mediterranean. During his time on board, the BELKNAP earned SURFLANT Battle Efficiency Award for cruiser for two consecutive cycles. LCDR Yerger stood condition three watch as Tactical Action Officer.

LCDR Yerger's next duty assignment was to the OPNAV staff in Washington, D.C. As a member of the Analysis and Evaluation Branch of the Theory and Strategic Nuclear Warfare Division (OP40) of the Plans, Policy, and Operations Directorate (OPAD), he utilized his subspecialty training to act as the SHOP RINGO analyst for the Navy. He also served as a member of the Strategic Techologies Assessment Group, part of the CNO sponsored study STRATPLAN 2010, sharing the Navy's course into the next century.
