

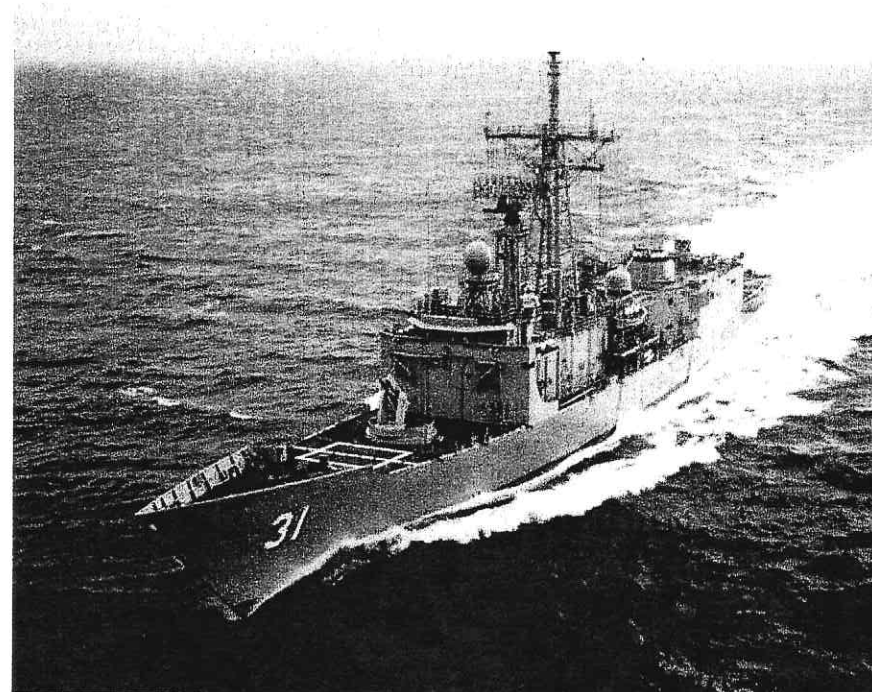

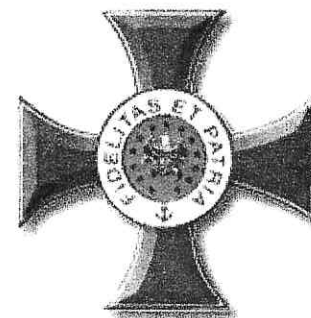

Captain Franklin D. Brangaccio, USN (Ret.)

Captain Dave Brangaccio is a native of Easton, Connecticut. He graduated from The Citadel in May 1984 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration and was commissioned as an officer in the Navy Reserve.

He reported aboard USS STARK (FFG-31) in April 1985 as Ordnance Officer after attending standard pipeline schools. While aboard STARK, he participated in Great Lakes Cruise '85 and conducted various operations throughout the western Atlantic before deploying to the Persian Gulf aboard STARK as its Main Propulsion Assistant.



Captain Brangaccio was on board STARK in May of 1987 when the ship was struck by two Iraqi air-to-surface missiles. Subsequent to the missile attack, he led a repair team responsible for dewatering efforts over large areas of the ship.

Captain Brangaccio left active service in September 1987 and joined the Reserve Component in 1991. He served in various leadership capacities over a 20 year reserve career, including tours as Commanding Officer, NR AOE-4 DETROIT DET 204, assignment to Readiness Command Region Southeast as Assistant Mobilization Officer, and as Executive Officer of SIMA, Mayport DET 308, Harbor Defense Command 206 and NR US EUCOM DET 208. Over this time period, he earned an MBA from the University of North Florida.

He most recently served as the Plans and Training Officer for Maritime Expeditionary Security Squadron Ten before retiring as a member of Voluntary Training Unit 7474G aboard NAS Jacksonville. Captain Brangaccio's decorations include the Joint Services Commendation Medal, Navy Commendation Medal with gold star, Navy Achievement Medal, and other unit and individual awards.

In his civilian career, since leaving active service in 1987, Captain Brangaccio has worked in the fraud prevention unit of major credit card company, served as the internal auditor for a division on CSX, and is currently an Operations Director with the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta. He works in downtown Jacksonville at the Jacksonville Branch of the bank and is responsible for one of two sets of staff nation-wide that make financial corrections and adjustments to commercial bank accounts.

He currently resides in Fleming Island, Florida with his wife, Shannon, and three sons: David, Mitchell and Jason.
