Captain Wesley R. McCall is a native of Tahlequah Oklahoma and 1990 graduate of the United States Naval Academy where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Oceanography. He was designated a Naval Aviator in November 1992 and has accumulated over 3,700 flight hours, including 3,400 hours in the H-60 F/H.

Captain McCall's sea assignments include his initial squadron tour with the HS-4 Black Knights; Helicopter Operations Officer for Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Central Command/Commander, U.S. FIFTH Fleet in Manama, Bahrain; Administrative and Maintenance Officer with the HS-2 Golden Falcons; Executive Officer and Commanding Officer of the HS-6 Indians and Navigator onboard the USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (CVN 73) home-ported in Yokosuka, Japan.

Captain McCall's shore assignments include Fleet Replacement Squadron Instructor Pilot, NATOPS, Standardization and Operations Officer with the HS-10 Warhawks and Protocol Officer for the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

He is a 2005 graduate of the College of Naval Command and Staff where he received a Master of Arts Degree in National Security and Strategic Studies and a 2013 graduate of the Joint Forces Staff College.

Captain McCall's awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), the Air Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (4 awards), the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (4 awards) and various other campaign and unit awards. He was the 1998 HS-10 Instructor Pilot of the Year and recipient of the Sea Combat Wing, U.S. Pacific Fleet Navy and Marine Corps Association peer-selected Leadership Award for 2009.
