GLEN S. LEVERETTE JR.
Captain, USN

COMMANDER

Captain (CAPT) Glen S. Leverette earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Political Science from the U.S. Naval Academy graduating with Merit in 1990 and hails from Jacksonville Florida. He received a Master of Arts in Education from Jacksonville University with a 4.0 GPA in 1996. He also earned a Master's of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College in 2010. CAPT Leverette was recognized as the distinguished graduate of his class.

As Deputy Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Korea from 2014-2017, CAPT Leverette was the first Naval Officer to lead in this capacity in the command's 60-year history.

As Commander Logistics Force, U.S. Naval Forces Central Command; Commander, Military Sealift Command Central Command; and Commander, Task Force 53; he led an estimated 2 billion-dollar-a-year logistics enterprise supporting maritime security operations in the Arabian Gulf from 2012-2014.

As Commanding Officer, RIVERINE SQUADRON II, he re-established the Navy's riverine combat capability after a 40-year hiatus. He directed 624 combat missions while deployed to western Iraq from 2006-2009. He has also served on numerous warships and afloat staffs during his other sea tours.

He is married to Marian Leverette, who holds Master's Degrees from Jacksonville University and the University of North Florida and serves as a program manager for Clay County Schools. Together they have one daughter, Kalea Leverette who is a graduate of The Florida State University in Tallahassee FL with Bachelor's Degrees in Biology and International Relations. His personal decorations include the Legion of Merit, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, a Presidential Unit Citation, Meritorious Service Medals and other service and campaign awards.
